## WHAT IS THE SCHOOL PARENT & FAMILY ENGAGEMENT PLAN?

What is it? This is a plan that describes how Pickens Junior High School will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Pickens Junior High values the contributions and involvement of parents in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement and of creating opportunities for parents to participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it developed/revised? Pickens Junior High School welcomes parent input and comments at any time regarding this plan, as well as the Title I School-wide Plan. Parent surveys will be available and parents are invited to attend Pickens County Parent Advisory Committee (PC PAC) meetings to involve parents in the development of this plan, the Schoolwide Plan, the Compact, and the use of 1% parent involvement funds. All parent feedback will be considered in the revision of all plans. The school will update the Parent Involvement Plan, at least annually, to meet the changing needs of parents and the school. The school will submit any comments to the district if the Title I Schoolwide Plan is not satisfactory to parents.

**Who is it for?** All students participating in the Title I, Part A Program and their families are both encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this PIP. Pickens Junior High will provide full opportunities for the participation of parents with limited English skills, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available? At the beginning of the year, the Parent Involvement Plan will be sent home with students in their Title I packets, posted on the school website, available at all schools, available at Title I Meetings, annual Title I events, and at the Pickens County Parent Action Committee meetings. Flexible scheduling will be available.

## What is Title I?

Pickens Junior High School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging State academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I Programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. ## **LET'S GET TOGETHER!**

Pickens Junior High School will host the following events to build the capacity for strong parental involvement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. Notices and invitations will be sent home with students, posted on Facebook, and transmitted via an all-call phone notice to inform families of these parent engagement opportunities. Programs are offered at various times and in various formats to provide parents with multiple opportunities to participate. Events are listed on the next page.

- Open House: Parents and students are able to meet their teacher and briefly learn about grade-level expectations.
- Annual Title I Meeting: Parents learn about Title I and Schoolwide Programs, the Georgia Standards of Excellence, the Georgia Milestones Assessment, our Title I Program including our School Improvement Plan, Parent/School/Student Compact, Title I Schoolwide Plan, and how the 1% parent involvement funds are spent, and other Title I requirements. This meeting will be held on September 25, 2018 at 6:30 p.m.
- Curriculum Night: Parents are provided information on grade-level expectations and assessments that students will be given throughout the year to assess the state standards of Georgia. During curriculum nights, teachers will help parents understand assessment results.
- Meetings will be held at flexible times such as in the mornings and evenings to accommodate all families who want to participate.
- Information will be distributed through various formats such as: online media, newsletters, flyers, inperson group meetings to provide parents with strategies to support student academic achievement.

## PICKENS JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL IS REACHING OUT

Pickens Junior High School will take the following measures to promote and support parents as important partners in strengthening and reaching school goals. We will:
