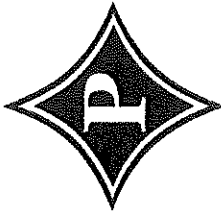

What is Title I?

Pickens Junior High is recognized as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards in order to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written Parent and Family Engagement Plan.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? This is a plan that tells how Pickens Junior High will improve parent and family engagement to support student learning. Pickens Junior High values the parents and family members, and the value they bring to the school. PJHS wants to establish a partnership for improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Pickens Junior High will support parent and family engagement. It also tells how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to improve student learning at school and at home.

How was it revised? Pickens Junior High School invited all parents to attend the input meeting. During the meeting, parents had the opportunity to review and revise the parental involvement plan, our school-parent compact, and the 1% Title I parent involvement money. Parents can provide ideas and give opinions throughout the year. The plan, school-parent compact, and other Title I information is posted on our school website. We also have the information available at the school office. We send home surveys to ask families for their suggestions on the plan, and how to use Title I money for parent engagement. The plan is updated each year to meet the changing needs of students and parents.

Who is it for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Pickens Junior High will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available? A copy of the plan is sent home with all students before November 1 of each year. It is posted on the school website and copies are available at the school office.

8th grade – 44% to 47%

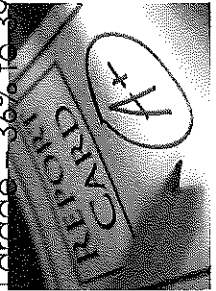

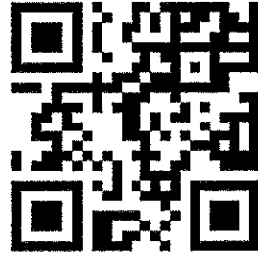
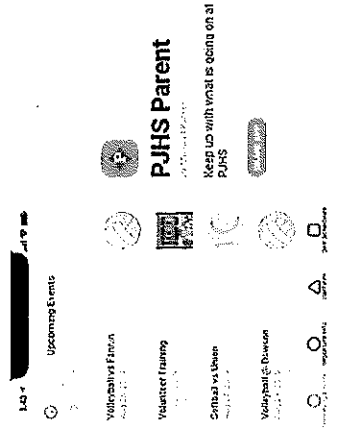

Pickens Junior High School will take the following measures to promote and support parents as important partners in strengthening and reaching school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities are published in English and other languages as needed, and in a language and format that all parents can understand. Information is posted on the school website and included in house newsletters.
- ✓ Educate staff members, with the input of parents, on the value of having parents participate and contribute their skills at school, on communication skills that will foster positive relationships with parents, on how to partner with parents, on how to have successful conversations about student data during Parent Nights, on sending home notifications in a format and in a language that parents can understand, and on having effective parent/teacher conferences.
- ✓ Collaborate with Jasper Middle School to share information about school activities and newsletters, to prepare parents and their children for Junior High, and to facilitate school transition.
- ✓ Share information via the school website and newsletters to help parents understand the school's academic standards/assessments, to assist parents in monitoring their child's progress, and to work with educators ensuring students' academic success.
- ✓ Communicate regularly regarding school-wide events and activities through phone messages, social media, school website, emails and/or flyers.
- ✓ Provide materials, as appropriate, to assist parents in working with their child to improve academic achievement.
- ✓ Work with parents to inform staff members of the importance of effective communication and parental involvement via newsletters and staff meetings.
- ✓ Collaborate with community leaders, business groups, and local residents to increase participation and awareness of school-parent involvement practices and activities.
- ✓ Listen and respond to parents' requests for additional support with parent involvement activities.
- ✓ Provide regular meeting opportunities if requested by parents.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Pickens Junior High School and our parents will develop a school/parent/student compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop collaboratively.
